***From Our Minister***

June Monthly Theme: Gathering Together

When I thought up this monthly theme in November, I imagined us getting off the boat and gathering by the side of that body of water we had just crossed. We would want to gather to share our experiences of the journey, what we had learned and what we wanted in this new land. We'd be looking over the maps we had made through collating the feedback from our spyglass meetings. I was not thinking of the annual meeting which mysteriously loomed ahead in May. Yet, that meeting ended up being a beautiful example of gathering together. It was wonderful to see you, the members and friends of South Valley, arriving through the doors of our building, checking in and then sitting together in our sanctuary. With attendance close to 70%, your unanimous vote called me to be a settled minister who will be among you for years to come. What a difference it made that we had so many members participating. I loved seeing people meeting old friends and making new ones. The first aspect of gathering is showing up when you can (I know that there were some who very much wanted to be at the meeting but couldn't). Another important aspect that we did well in that gathering was making room for people with different ideas and opinions. This is part of democracy—to remain open to people whose ideas differ from your own even when the way that they exercise their freedom could lead to an outcome you don't want. Detaching from outcome, as best we could, created an atmosphere of mutual respect. This is good practice when meeting people for the first time or deepening existing relationships. When we approach communication with spaciousness, we welcome the ways people are different from us. In the annual meeting, you created an atmosphere of hospitality for all who attended. I hope that memories of this meeting call us to both show up and welcome the ways we are different from one other.

The joy was palpable. Something I have loved in this community from the beginning is your huge capacity to be joyful. At first, I saw that mostly at our large parties. Now, I'm seeing it at worship services and most recently at our annual meeting. When we gather, let us seek joy and courageously choose joy over fear. Even when committee business is mundane, it is wonderful when that time can bring us joy. Lorri Quigley spoke of this when she thanked Brenda Voisard for her service on the Leadership Succession Team. No matter how difficult Brenda's day had been, her smile lit up the room. Many of you hold this gift of happiness. Using this gift whenever you can lifts our community. I see it in the choir when we rehearse. I saw it at the Homeless Youth Resource Center when I prepared food with Kevin Alvey and Peggy Montrone. I felt it in the youth at the retreat in the mountains when we took a long walk and saw deer in the forest. Experiencing joy together is a good reason to gather.

As the years pass, may the Annual Meeting of 2015 be a memory we hold dear of a joyful new beginning.

**The Inn Between** is Utah's *first* hospice house for the homeless. It is a safe, comfortable place where the homeless can spend their final days, weeks or months receiving professional hospice care. Fresh clothing and bedding, healthy meals, activities, emotional and spiritual support are provided. Help is offered to reconnect clients with estranged family members, and after they pass, a memorial is posted on their website, a community memorial service is held, and a marker is placed in their Memorial Garden.

**Registration:** We can have only 10 vehicles; and we can probably fit a few more vehicles in. No RV hookups. First paid/first reserved. Any vehicle is \$40.00. If you pre-pay you do not need a paid pass from the gate. There are no hookups/non-electric. Day use \$10.00. Covered main pavillion main area with fire pit(s). Anyone camping overnight must complete a **Reservation Form** and submit it to SVUU along with payment. We will pass the hat during the service.

**Activities:** Hiking trails. Timpanogos cave. Alpine loop drive. Cascade springs. Fishing in a few small lakes a short drive away or the creek. Potluck dinner Saturday night. Sunday service followed by a potluck lunch. Guitars, singers, board games, horseshoes, badminton, welcome.

**Safety:** High altitude (7000 feet), bright sun & cold fall nights! Bring sunscreen, bug dope, jacket, hat, gloves, etc. SVUU does not perform first aid. Children are the total and full responsibility and in the care of the parents/adults bringing them. Please consider the environment, use bio-degradable soap and pack out all trash. The forest service is requesting that you use local firewood, and not bring firewood in.

**Campground/:** Check in 3 PM Fri. out by 2 PM Mon. Tents can be spread thru-out. ADA accessible restrooms (sorry no showers this time). Dogs allowed/but must be leashed.
