From Our Minister

Minister's Newsletter for July, 2017
Monthly theme: Journey

Buddhist travelers in Japan often leave stones by the side of the road. Pilgrims add to these solitary stones and through the centuries ancient holy paths have become lined with stones like New Yorkers along their Thanksgiving Day parade. To me, the piles of stones are evidence that others have walked before. Others have carried their burdens to that place and then, at least symbolically, laid them down. I love that kind of journey that takes me in airplanes or trains or cars or walking over unknown land. And yet, the most significant journeys I have made have been inner journeys when I hardly moved at all. Being among you, serving this community, has been one of those life journeys. Through being here, I have been given that opportunity to experience what T.S. Eliot describes in the Little Gidding: the end of all our exploring will be to arrive where we started and know the place for the first time. This valley and state are in many ways where I started. The Tabernacle where we sang as a Unitarian Universalist choir was the site of the radio broadcasts I heard most Sundays of my childhood no matter where we were living. When I looked up at that beautiful organ or when I return to Provo as I will at the end of June to tell my story to the BYU gay support group, I will be going to a place of beginning as if I'm going for the first time. Being a Unitarian Universalist minister here has given me a chance to be who I am now here and that has made this place a new place. I have been able to begin again. I am grateful for that opportunity.

This past year, I have begun the adventure of sabbatical. These are the months that a minister earns for each year of service. Usually, the minister takes them all in one year but since that is hard on a congregation, I have begun taking one month a year beginning this year. I plan to spend these months taking journeys to deepen my ministry with you. This year, my sabbatical month was taken as a pilgrimage to Transylvania to broaden my understanding of Unitarian history and bring that back to you. Please watch the sermon I gave the second week of June when I returned if you would like to share in this understanding.

During July, you will have a chance to hear about each other's journeys in the worship services. Please attend and you will discover the amazing people sitting around you each Sunday morning. If journeys take you away this summer. May you be safe. May all be well.

We also need lots of people to help with sorting and pricing on Wednesday and Thursday evenings, August 2nd and 3rd, from 6 to 9 p.m. And we definitely need people to help on the day of the yard sale, Saturday, August 5. Beginning early at 7 a.m., and rotating in 2-hour shifts, we will need people to put out signs and balloons, move eye-catching things out to the front lawn, anchor the checkout table, help customers with questions and keep things organized and displayed.

And finally, there will be *lots* of help needed to pack up leftover goods in boxes and bags, haul out to the UAID truck that will take away unsold items, take down tables, vacuum the sanctuary, and put the chairs back in order, so that when we show up on Sunday morning, it looks as if nothing ever happened.
